SUBJECT: COVID-19 Booster Doses – Updated Eligibility for Adolescents

On February 14, 2022, the Government of Ontario further <u>expanded eligibility</u> for COVID-19 booster doses.<sup>1</sup> Beginning February 18, all adolescents 12 to 17 years of age will be eligible to receive a booster dose without needing to meet any further eligibility criteria (e.g. based on underlying medical conditions).

Additionally, adolescents 12 to 17 years of age will be recommended to receive their booster dose six months (168 days) following their primary series. While this is not currently reflected in the provincial COVID-19 Third Dose Recommendations<sup>2</sup>, updates are expected to follow shortly.

While the eligibility for booster doses has now broadened substantially, booster doses are still most important for those individuals who are at greatest risk of morbidity and mortality from COVID-19, including adolescents with underlying medical conditions, residents of congregate settings, and individuals who belong to racialized and/or marginalized communities.<sup>3</sup> Please consider if there are ways to promote the importance of booster doses to these patients.
